### Spirit-

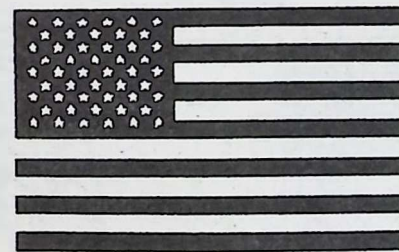
*Vital essence of man, considered divine in origin of the mind.*
