WE HAVE GREAT COOKBOOKS IN THE LIBRARY. THIS IS A RECIPE FROM "THE PIONEER LADY'S COUNTRY KITCHEN" BY A LOCAL AUTHOR. SNOW ICE CREAM...ONE OF THE GREATEST TASKS IN LIFE IS TO SIT BY A WARM FIRE AND EAT SNOW ICE CREAM. ALL YOU NEED TO REMEMBER IS TO BRUSH THE TOP LAYER OFF CLEAN SNOW AND DIP OUT THE CLEAN CENTER, NEVER DIPPING THE CUP DEEP ENOUGH TO PICK UP DIRT FROM THE GROUND OR OFF OLD BOARDS OR BUILDINGS. TO MAKE SNOW ICE CREAM, WHIP 1 CUP OF HEAVY CREAM. THEN FOLD IN SUGAR AND VANILLA EXTRACT TO TASTE. TAKE A LARGE BOWL OUTSIDE AND SCOOP UP ABOUT ONE QUART (4 CUPS) OF PERFECTLY CLEAN SNOW. WHILE THE SNOW IS STILL FROZEN, FOLD IT INTO THE CREAM MIXTURE, AND ADJUST THE SUGAR AND VANILLA TO TASTE. EAT IMMEDIATELY OR PACK THE BOWL IN A SNOWBANK (WELL COVERED TO PROTECT THE ICE CREAM FROM WILD OR DOMESTICATED ANIMALS) AND LET IT CHILL UNTIL THE ICE CREAM HAS HARDENED. MAKES ABOUT 6 SERVINGS.
