Butte Falls Lioness Club News by- Ella Pingle

The Butte falls Lioness Club's March meeting was attended by four members of our Lions sponsoring club, the Eagle Point Lions. They reported their club would be celebrating their 50th Anniversary of Lionism and invited our club to attend. Other guests were Sherri Messer, Excutive Director of the Southern Oregon Lions Sight and Hearing Center of Medford; Carrie Driskell of the Butte Falls Ambulance and Sara Matthews, Sophmore of Butte Falls High who spoke on "what is involved in being Student of the month". Two new members were in attendance, Lioness Carol Nicholls & Connie McGraff. Did you know lioness Ellen Moore is board secretary of the Southern Oregon Lions Sight and Hearing Center? And, now the answer to "Where do all the old glasses go that the Lions collect"? In Oregon, these glasses go to the Oregon Lions Sight & Hearing foundation in Portland, from Lion Clubs around the state where volunteers take up the task of sorting into specific categories, prescription lenses that require calibration, sunglasses, readers, children glasses, unusable etc. The glasses that need calibration are transported to the Oregon Women's Correctional facility in Pendleton. Inmate volunteers determine the prescription of the lenses, clean, package and label them. They are then transported to a storage place in Portland & stored at no charge. Before they are shipped to those in need, they are sorted into a library that allows the glasses to be easily dispensed. Lions, eye care professionals and other volunteers are recruited to travel to foreign countries to dispense these to those in need. (The U.S. law prohibits dispensing used eye-glasses here)

In a joint venture eyeglass Mission to Mexico, between the Lions of Oregon and the AMIGOS Club from the Pacific University of optometric programs, a congingency was made up of about 40 Lions from throughout the state, three drs. And ten university students. Also, a team of volunteers catalogued about 8000 pairs. With the Mexican local Lions help, facilities and transportaion, a clinic was held in Puerto Vallarta, one in town of Las Vavas and three in the town of San Blas. Lions and professionals

worked to serve over 2000 people including over 500 children, 1600 of these people were provided with glasses.

These facts are from Lion Clyde Wood, council chairman of the Oregon Lions. Lion Clyde was a participant in the joint venture eyeglass mission to Mexico.

The Butte Falls Lioness Club collects glasses as one of their many projects. What may be a castoff for one person can be the gift of sight to a person in need.
