Recipe of the Month: Maple Glazed Bananas

1/2 c. butter 1TBS. Lemon juice
 1/2 c. packed brown sugar
 1/2 c. maple or maple flavor syrup
 1 tsp. Finely shredded lemon peel
 1/4 tsp. Ground Clove
 6 firm ripe bananas, halved lengthwise & cut into 1 inch pieces
 1 quart vanilla ice cream

*In large heavy skillet melt butter over medium heat. Stir in brown sugar, syrup, lemon peel and juice and clove. Bring to boiling. Reduce heat: simmer for

2 minutes. Add bananas; spoon some of the syrup mix over bananas. Cover and cook about 2 minutes more or till heated through. Remove from heat. Scoop ice cream into dessert dishes. Spoon warm bananas & syrup over ice cream.
