Candy bars are still only 50 cents and we also have a pretty good selection of books for sale to take camping or on a trip.

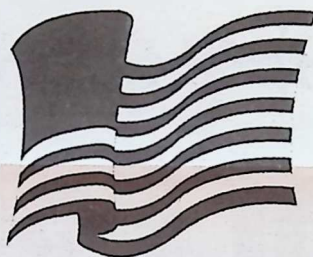
