OCTOBER IS NATIONAL FIRE PREVENTION MONTH!

The Butte Falls Fire Department is concerned about your safety always. So we're taking a minute to alert you that October is Fire Prevention Month. It's a good time to check and double check how safe your home and personal property are from any kind of fire. Fire is the third leading cause of accidental death in the United States.

Here are some tips to help you and your family stay safe:



1. Install and maintain smoke alarms
2. Draw an Escape Plan of your home
3. Practice the Plan with the entire family
4. Keep and maintain appropriate fire extinguishers in strategic areas throughout your home, car, and outbuildings
5. Remember: Space heaters need space, at least 3 feet from anything that can burn
6. Smokers: Never smoke in bed or when you are drowsy! Use large, deep ashtrays and put water on butts before discarding them.
7. Be careful cooking: never leave cooking unattended
8. Keep matches and lighters out of the reach of children
9. Use electricity safely
10. Clean and check your chimneys regularly
11. Prepare a Fire Hazard Reduction Plan for your property: Clear underbrush, thin trees, stack wood a safe distance from buildings, pile slash away from other burnable materials including trees
12. Request your local fire department to help assess the fire potential in and around your home.
