

ORDINANCE # 232



An ordinance regulating alcoholic beverages within the Town park and public places. The Butte Falls Town Council doth ordain as follows:

Section 1: Drinking in public places: no person shall drink or consume alcoholic liquor in or on a street, alley, mall, parking lot or structure, motor vehicle, public grounds or other public place, unless the place has been licensed for that purpose by the Oregon Liquor Control Commission. Provided, however consumption of alcoholic liquor is permitted in a park when a permit has been obtained from the council.

Section 2: Permits: The town council reserves the right to issue permits for a beer garden within the park boundaries. The person purchasing the permit must be certified by OLCC as a server. Also the town will require that proof of liquor liability be in effect. No one with a felony record or a DUI on their driving record will be allowed to purchase a permit to serve liquor or an alcoholic beverage within the Town Park.

Section 3: Special Occasions: The town council reserves the right to issue a permit allowing for the consumption of alcoholic liquor in the town park. The council reserves the right to determine what is a special occasion. Persons wishing to purchase a permit will apply to the town council at a regular council meeting, so that the council may determine the special occasion. No one with a felony record or DUI will be allowed to purchase a special occasion permit.

Section 4: OLCC Permits: An OLCC permit may be required by anyone wanting to purchase a permit from the Town of Butte Falls. The permit must be approved by the town council and the town marshal.

Section 5: Penalty for violation of ordinance: Any person violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall, upon conviction thereof, be punished by a fine of not more than \$250 or by Oregon State Law that applies to liquor violations.

Section 6: **THIS ORDINANCE SUPERSEDES ANY OTHER ORDINANCE PERTAINING TO THE USE OF ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES WITHIN THE TOWN LIMITS OF BUTTE FALLS.**

Starting in the month of June all vehicles parked on city streets without current registration will be issued parking tickets. Also any cars parked in alleyways will receive a ticket from Code Enforcement.

Dawg Gone It!!

Some may think it is quaint and charming to have dogs roaming freely throughout the town's parks and streets. However the Town of Butte Falls has received numerous complaints regarding dogs running loose.

Warnings to several owners have not rectified the problem. Unattended dogs in the park are unacceptable, inconsiderate and irresponsible. Unsupervised dogs are a serious health issue and a potential problem to our children, pets and general public. Two dog bites have been reported within the last six months. The Town being put on notice of the problem is now potentially liable in the event of dog bites or traffic accidents if immediate action is not taken.

Last month seven dogs were seen running loose in the street, in the park and one was even sleeping in the middle of Broad Street causing cars to drive around.

With help from Jackson County Animal Control, we will begin enforcing dog regulations, including licensing and impounding of loose dogs within the town limits. Fines will be levied; loose dogs are subject to rabies and other diseases so dogs will receive appropriate shots at the owner's expense. They will no longer be allowed to roam free within the town. If you care about your pets, be a responsible pet owner and keep them on a lease and do not let them roam free.
