



Hello to everyone!

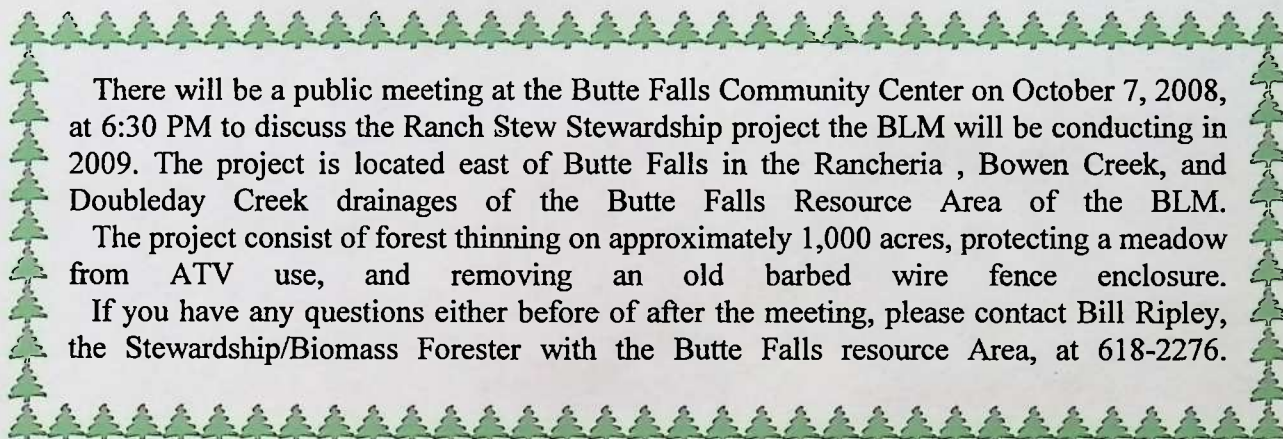
