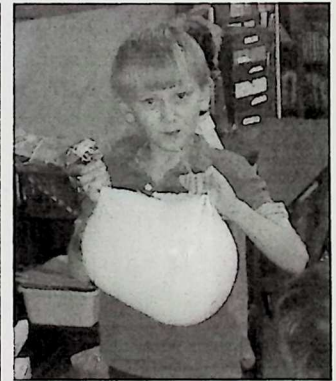
- Small class size- Leads to more individualized direct instruction. Teachers are on a more personalized level with student. It is easier to address individual needs of each student.
