

YOUR TOWN NEEDS HELP!

The Town of Butte Falls has at least five Budget Committee positions that are currently vacant. Some of these positions have been vacant for a very long time; but need to be filled for the Town to function at its best.

If you meet the qualifications and could perform the four tasks listed below, please consider volunteering to help by calling City Hall today. This is an excellent opportunity to learn the inner workings of your town, and to give input into financial matters!

The Budget Committee is an advisory group, made up of the Town Council and an equal number of appointed members. Appointed members must be qualified voters of the town, and cannot be town employees, officers, or agents. The purpose of the Budget Committee is to:

Review the proposed budget.

Listen to comments and questions from interested citizens.

Revise the budget to reflect any changes based on public comment or committee member input.

Approve the budget and forward it to the Town Council for adoption

Budget Committee members are not subject to any financial liability or obligation regarding the funds or how they are spent.

The first meeting is held in May (usually on a Tuesday night at 7:00 pm) at the Community Hall, and typically lasts about two hours. Over the last five years, only one committee meeting was required to approve the budget.
