Could we also institute an Ordinance Task Force (OTF) to assist in highlighting areas of concern, work with citizens for achieving compliance, and assist in restructuring antiquated ordinances? How can we all (local and outside business owners, landlords and property owners, Mayor and council members, and individuals like you and me) work more effectively for the community?
