I had the question of, "Why are the post office box holders in Lyle charged an exorbitant amount per year when the Dallesport boxes are free?" I asked the Dallesport Postmaster but really did not comprehend the answer ... or maybe I was too angry to accept.

I received this information from one who lives there: "What I heard ... about 15 years ago, someone started a suit against the post office because it was not fair to charge residents for the only way they could get mail. Dallesport residents have no other option than

to have a PO Box because there is no mail delivery here. Do all Lyle residents use the post office in order to receive their mail? If so, then they should not be charged. If they have mail delivery to their homes, then they would need to pay for their PO Box because the box is not necessary. Dallesport residents must show proof and sign a form each year showing that they are residents here.'
