OWA announces scholarship for Oregon students

The Columbia Gorge chapter of Oregon Women for Agriculture (OWA) has announced its annual \$500 scholarship for high school students. Scholarship forms are available from local high school guidance counselors or by emailing columbiagorgeowa@gmail.com.

The student must be or have been a resident of Hood River, Wasco, Sherman or Gilliam counties a minimum of two years during their high school education. Preference goes to a student with a 3.0 GPA or higher, pursuing a major in agricultural studies, and female.

Applications must be postmarked no later than May 1 of the given year.

Money is expected to be used for tuition and/or books, and will be disbursed to the student's school following proof of enrollment. Scholarship may be used for an accredited school outside of Oregon.

Oregon Women for Agriculture was organized 50 years ago by Willamette Valley farm women who were concerned with regulatory issues impacting the grass seed industry. Since that time, this all-volunteer group has broadened its scope to include nearly all facets of agriculture and areas of our state. The group's mission is "Working Together To Communicate The Story Of Today's Agriculture." The Columbia Gorge chapter currently has 16 members and focuses on promoting agriculture through sponsorships of local agricultural events, displays at county fairs, placing crop identification signs along major highways and roads, awarding a scholarship to a high school senior who intends to major in agriculture, and sponsoring a local teacher to attend Oregon State University's Summer Agriculture Institute.
