WILL DEVELOP BRICK AND TILE INDUSTRY

E. F. Arnold, of Glenada, had several specimens of clay, which he was showing in town last week. These had been baked in a stove oven, but proved that the samples which were taken off the surface of the ground where cattle tramped, contained a good quality of fire and potters clay.

Samples have been sent to the Oregon Agricultural College and to Seattle where the returned reports claim it to be a fine quality of clay.

This deposit is found on Peter Erhart's ranch on Tsilcoos lake and is located near where the Willamette Pacific railroad is to be built.

Messrs Erhart and Arnold have formed a company to develop this product and will soon begin in a small way to manufacture brick. Later when transportation makes it possible they plan to manufacture brick, tile and hollow ware upon a larger scale.
