## BURGLARS ENTER STORE

Sometime after midnight Saturday night thieves broke in the west door of J. P. Cox's grocery and confectionary store and carried the cash register to the river side of Brynd's warehouse where the contents was removed.

The amount of cash secured was nearly \$60, and some small silver change and pennies remained in the register when Mr. Cox found it. The drawers of the register were open and full of rain water.

No clew was found that gave indication who the thieves might be.

## CONSTRUCTION OF WHARF COMMENCED

John Tanner who has the contract for constructing the wharf at Glenada, for Porter Brothers, Grant Smith & Co., commenced driving piling Monday.

One part of the wharf will be 55x50 feet, and the other 50x90 feet.

It is located at the foot of the alley in block 19, and is a block and a half below the city dock in Glenada. The contractors have a right of way through Glenada streets and alleys and are securing temporary right-of-way through the property belonging to private interests.

Surveys and soundings indicate good depth of water at this dock and show 10 feet at low tide.
