BARGE FREDERICK ON NORTH JETTY

Late Friday afternoon the barge Frederick was driven on the north jetty and is now laying broadside on the enrockment. The tug Roscoe was well inside the river and the Frederick over the bar when the barge became unmanageable and sheared on to the end of the north jetty.

The Frederick is heavily loaded with railroad construction material and supplies, estimated at about \$50,000. The barge itself is estimated at \$25,000.

J. P. Porter is now in charge of the situation and was at the mouth of the river when the barge struck.

Before settling down on the enrockment the barge battered out about 35 bents of the trestle work and caused damage that will result in a material delay to the jetty extension this season.

From present indications the the cargo and barge will be saved. No material change as to position of the barge has happened since Friday night, and the work of salvage will be rushed.

CHAS. WATTS, JEWELER LOCATES IN FLORENCE

The Tillamook and Patsy brought in store fixtures for Mr. Watts, and he has secured space in the front room of the Rita Theatre as temporary quarters, and is now ready to serve the public in the capacity of watch repairing, agate mounting, and jewelry repairing.

He will also put in a full stock of jewelry.

Later Mr. Watts expects to locate in a new building which will soon be erected.

WILL OPEN MEAT MARKET IN GLENADA
