BOARD OF EDUCATION HELD MEETING ON FRIDAY APRIL 4

At a meeting of the Board of Education held in Eugene Wednesday April 4, the following was among the business transacted.

The Lane county board of education met in the office of County School Superintendent E. J. Moore yesterday afternoon and re-elected the supervisors for another year, except in supervisory district No. 5, where Miss Goldie Van Bibber handed in her resignation, to take effect June 1. These members are elected for one year only.

The resignation of Miss Goldie Van Bibber was accepted with sincere regrets. There are already several applicants for her position.

Additional regulations for the standardization of schools for next year were also discussed. The board aims to secure a better class of teachers and better schools for next year, the idea being that as soon as a school attains a high quality of work it shall be "standardized."

The members of the county educational board are E. J. Moore, of Eugene, chairman; W. C. Washburne, of Junction City, secretary; Oliver Veatch, of Cottage Grove; W. L. Wheeler, of Pleasant Hill; L. B. Cushman, of Acme, newly appointed, who was unable to be present at this meeting.

The board will meet again in two weeks at which time a successor to Miss Van Bibber will be elected.

JUST TO SHOW THAT THEY COULD

A rather peculiar incident occurred at the jetty on the first day of April which proved to be rather interesting for several persons and a pup.
