SELECT WORDS FOR SPELLING CONTEST

At a regular meeting of the Siuslaw Teacher's Association held at Acme March 28th the subject of spelling contests was discussed. This supervisory district has been using the contest words sent out from Eugene so far this year. The results have been very unsatisfactory an account of the words not being taken from the work which had been covered. For this reason the pupils have become discouraged and have lost interest in the contests and the teachers have felt that they were a hindrance rather than a help. In order to become standard it is necessary for a school to enter into the spelling contests, but they are not obliged to use the contest words sent from Eugene. Therefore the Association appointed a committee, consisting of Miss Van Biober, Miss McFarland and Miss East, which is to make a list of fifty words for each contest. WILL BUILD HOTEL AT WESTLAKE SOON

H. C. Morris, a member of the Westlake Realty Co., and W. M. Whittaker, of Portland arrived in Florence last week. They are on their way to Westlake, a summer resort which has been platted on Tsiltcoos lake.

In conversation with the gentlemen they spoke of plans for many improvements to be carried on this season that would help to make Tsiltcoos lake known as one of the finest summer resorts on the Oregon coast.
