AUTO STAGE NOW RUNNING TO UMPQUA

Geo. Fisk is now running his auto stage to the mouth of the Umpqua and return. Friday he made a trial trip across Ten Mile and Five Mile outlets without difficulty and has since crossed daily. He has spent several weeks testing the best and safest methods to cross these streams, and after investigating the sand has found that with his large flat tires he can go through easily.

He has now commenced a regular daily service from river to river, making the run in about two hours. Arrangements have been made for boat connections with Florence, Gardiner, Scottsburg, the Drain stage and Auto stage to Coos Bay. This makes it possible to make a through trip to Coos Bay from Florence in one day.

Mr. Fisk believes the additional travel this way during the coming summer demands something of the kind and now has successfully proven that the auto stage is a success.

CAPT. SAFLEY HAS ANOTHER LAUNCH

Capt. Wm. Safley will soon put another gasoline launch on the Florence-Mapleton run. It is 32 feet in length with an 8 foot beam. The launch was built by H. T. Robinson and was brought down the river about a week ago.

The cabin has a hard oil finish inside and will have upholstered seats. The boat is painted white. Capt. Safley has installed a 15 horse power Buffalo engine, and had the launch out for a trial Sunday, when it made a neat and attractive appearance.

It is to be called "Queen" and the intention is to put her on the river run leaving Mapleton in the morning for Florence and returning to Mapleton in the afternoon. Ben Martin will be in charge.
