TO GET MORE EGGS BREED BEST HENS

People who want white chickens breed them without difficulty; everybody knows that much of the law of heredity. The same law applies to chickens with five toes, or with feathered legs, or topknots, or any other characteristic. Why not apply this law to secure a better supply of fresh winter laid eggs?
The average hen in this country produces about 70 eggs per annum. The champion hen, a cross breed, in Oregon, has recently completed a record of 303 eggs laid in 12 months. The champion hen had only common-sense treatment, no stimulation or coddling. There is a wide difference between these two records. The first is the result of ignorance and indifference to the laws of heredity, the other is the result of an intelligent strict compliance with those laws.
People who want fresh eggs in winter should hatch such eggs as they know are laid by their best winter laying hens; so it follows that they should know right now which hens are laying and how many eggs each of these hens lays in each of the winter months. The idea is, simply this: Use for breeding both males and females which are known to have or to inherit the character wanted.—Oregon Journal.

C. L. McNARY

Charles L. McNary, now a member of the Supreme Court of the State of Oregon, has announced his candidacy on the Republican ticket for one of the positions on that tribunal, there being four Justices to be nominated by the people in the May Primaries. Justice McNary is a resident of Salem, having been born of pioneer parents forty years ago on a farm near that city.
After acquiring his early education in the Salem public schools, and his collegiate and legal education by supporting himself, Justice McNary entered upon his profession in Salem, more than 15 years ago. For several years he served as Assistant District Attorney for the Third Judicial District, and won the reputation of being a fearless prosecutor. For six years,



in fact until his accession to the Supreme Court, he was the Dean of the Willamette College of Law, and made it one of the ranking colleges of the West.
Reared with the common class, he early learned to know the wants, needs and sufferings of the masses, and has always been a staunch champion of their cause. During his career as a Justice of the Supreme Court he has endeavored to interpret the law as a living progressive science, rather than as a rule too old to be corrected if found inapplicable to present day conditions and has written many important decisions. It was Justice McNary who wrote the forceful and much discussed dissenting opinion in the State vs E. S. J. McAllister. Defining the duties of courts in this opinion he said in part: "The value of law is its proximity to reason, its certainty and universality. The

abuses in the administration of law is to adhere blindly to a rule that savors of iniquity simply because it is a judicial decision. The first duty of a court is to decide the law correctly so far as it lies within the human mind. The next duty is to smite that rule of human action which is found to be unjust, however well it may be buttressed by precedent."

He is now, and has been for a number of years, President of the Salem Fruit Union, an organization engaged in developing the fruit industry in the State, and he is confident that the day is not far distant when Oregon will lead the world in agricultural products.

SUMMONS

In the Circuit Court for the State of Oregon, for Lane County.
Hazen D. Johnson, Plaintiff, vs. J. D. Asher, Defendant, Summons
To J. D. Asher, the above named defendant:
In the name of the State of Oregon: You are hereby required to appear and answer the complaint filed against you in the above entitled suit within six weeks from April 11th 1914, which is the date of the first publication hereof, and if you fail so to appear and answer, for want thereof, plaintiff will take a default against you, and will apply to the court for a decree declaring and adjudging that plaintiff is the owner and that the defendant have no estate or interest whatever in or to a certain piece of land, described as follows, to wit:
Beginning at a meander line of the Siuslaw River at a point on the E. line of Lot six, Section 36, Township 18 south, range 12 west, run south on said line to a point six chains north of southeast corner of said lot six, west five chains, north to meander line of said river, thence follows said meander line to beginning; seven acres all in Lane county, Oregon; and also, that the said defendant, his heirs, executors, or assigns, be forever barred from asserting any claim whatever in or to said land or premises adverse to the plaintiff, and that he have such other general relief as may be just, together with costs and disbursements.
Service of this summons is made on you by publication by order of Honorable L. T. Harris, Judge of the circuit court of the State of Oregon for Lane county, made on the 2nd day of April 1914, directing that said publication be made in the Siuslaw Pilot for six weeks.
