Lane county has 11,655 registered voters, according to the count of registration which closed May 1, but the final count of which was not finished until Saturday night after 6 o'clock. Of this number more than one-third, or 4190, are women. Of the whole number more than half are republicans and more than a fourth are democrats.

Although the registration is 400 short of the figure anticipated by the county officials and the number sought by the politicians, it is larger than any previous registration in Lane county, not counting the women. Only two counties in the state have a larger registration than Lane. These are Multnomah with a total registration of 74,875, and Marion with 14028 enrolled. Clackamas with an enrollment of 11,479, rubs Lane closely with forth.

The county registration books show that the registration of the women differs little from that of the men, except that the women are more inclined to register with the prohibition party, which is stronger in Lane county than any other except the republican and democrat. But on the whole they show that a third of the republicans and a third of the democrats, and so on, are women.

An abstract of the total number of voters registered in Lane county for the primaries will be sent to the secretary of state by County Clerk Russell today.

The work of compiling the abstract was completed yesterday by Miss Grace Lee, one of the registrars. The total number of voters registered in each of the 90 precincts of the county is as follows:

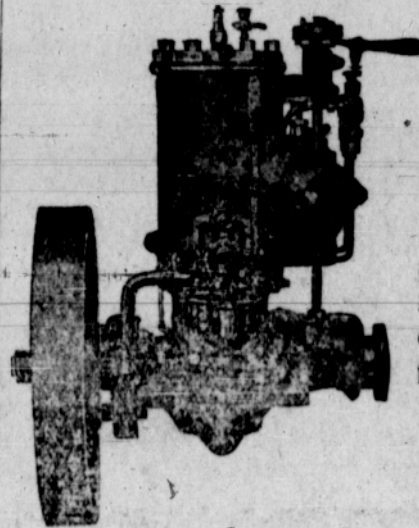
