WITHEYCOMBE REPUBLICAN FOR GOVERNOR

Portland, Ore., May 16.—Dr. James Witheycombe was nominated for governor by the Republicans in Friday's primaries. Dr. C. J. Smith was nominated for the same office by the Democrats. C. N. McArthur was nominated by the Republicans for representative in congress from the third (Portland) district, defeating A. W. Lafferty, incumbent.

These results on partial returns from all counties and announced late today, removed the only remaining uncertainties as to results on important offices.

The following national committeemen were elected: H. M. Esterly, Democrat; Ralph E. Williams, Republican; Henry Waldo Coe, Progressive.

The returns indicated the nomination of the following candidates for congressmen first district.—Representative, W. C. Hawley, Republican; Fred W. Mears, Progressive; Frederick Hollister, Democrat.

BINGHAM NOMINATED BY REPUBLICANS

Later and nearly complete returns from Friday's primary election do not change in particular the lane county nominations as forecasted in Saturday mornings Register. On the republican ticket, I. H. Bingham is nominated for senator from Lane county, E. D. Cusick of Albany, for joint senator from Linn and Lane, and Allen Eaton and W. B. Dillard are assured of nomination for representative from Lane county, while third place is close contested between Elbert Bede of Cottage Grove and Melvin Fenwick Springfield, with 87 out of 90 precincts complete, Bede has a lead of two votes. W. B. Calkins is nominated for county judge, S. M. Russell for clerk, C. B. Christensen for sheriff, S. W. Taylor for treasurer, W. W. Branstetter for coroner, and M. H. Harlow for county commissioner.

The only contest on the democratic ticket was for commissioner, G. G. Gross winning out by a large majority over his opponents.—Register.

PLANS FOR ODD FELLOW BUILDING

Wm. Kyle has received the plans for the proposed new I. O. O. F. temple. They were drawn by Architect Ford of Eugene, and show a very imposing structure.

It is to be three-stories high and cover the lodge property at the corner of Front and Washington streets. The first floor will have four business rooms, three facing Front street and one on Washington street. A boiler room is also provided for on this floor.

The lodge hall will be on the second floor and will be 56 by 38 feet. Opening off the lodge room will be a secretary's room, anti-room, preparation room, a room for each organization, the Encampment, Rebekahs, and the Subordinate lodge. On this floor will also be three office rooms facing on Washington street.

The third story shows a large and convenient kitchen and a magnificent banquet room.
