REGISTRATION

OPENS JUNE 1

Registration for the November election will open probably on June 1, according to the announcement made through the county clerk's office. The secretary of state set May 20, as the date on which registration should open, but an opinion given by the attorney general to Stacy Russell, county clerk, leaves it optional with the county clerk, or rather, "as soon after the primary election as convenient."

At present the county clerk's force is busy canvassing the vote at the primary election, and it will be almost a week before this work can be fully cleared up. In Portland a separate department from that handling the election returns attends to registration, but in Lane the two must be done by one staff.

Registration is necessary for the November election, only by those who failed to register for the primary election. The elector has from June 1 to October 15 to do so.—Guard.

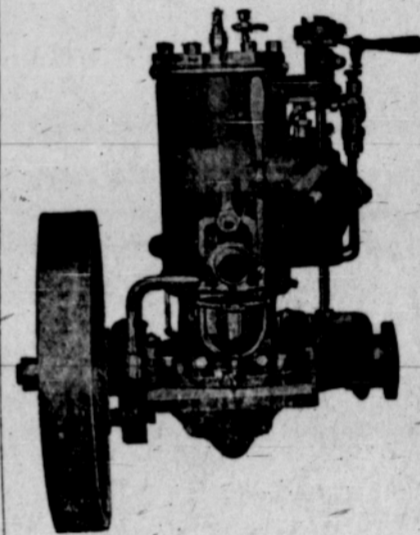
