For the information of those concerned we are publishing by equest of the ing extracts from "The Law for the Protection and Preser or the Protection and Preser of the United States"
Section 13:-"That it shall no be lawful to throw, discharge, o
deposit, or cause, suffer, or pro
or deposit either from or out of any ship, barge, or other floating craft of any kind, or from the shore, wharf, manufacturing establishment, or mill of any kind, any refuse matter of any kind or description whatever other than that flowing from streets and sewers and passing an $\bar{y}$ naviz a liquid state, into any navigable water of the United States, or into any tributary of any navigable water from which the same shall float or be washed into such navigable water; and it shall not be lawful deposit, or cause, suffer, or procure to be deposited material bank of any navigable water, on the bank of any tributary of on the bank of any tributary of
any navigable water, where the any navigable water, where the
same shall be liable to be washed into such navigable water, either by ordinary or high tides, or by storms or floods, or otherwise whereby navigation shall or may be impeded or obstructed Provided, That nothing herein contained shall extend to, apply to, or prohibit the operations in connection with the improve ment of navigable waters or con struction of public works, con sidered necessary and proper by the United States officers super vising such improvement or
public work: And provided fur public work: And provided fur-
ther, That the Secretary of War, whenever in the judgement of and navigation will not be injured thereby, may permit the deposit of any material above mentioned in navigable waters, within limits to be defined and under conditions
to be prescribed by him, provide application is made to him prio to depositing such material; and whenever any permit is so grant ed the conditions thereof shal be strictly complied with, and
any violation thereof shall be un-
lawful.
Extract from Section 16: That every person and every cor poration that shall violate, or that
shall knowingly aid, abet, author shall knowingly aid, abet, author
ize or instigate a violation of th provisions of sections thirteen,
fourteen, and fifteen of this Act shall be guilty of a mis demeanor, and on conviction
thereof shall be punished by a fine not exceeding twenty-five hundred dollars nor less than five hundred dollars, or by imprison ment (in case of a natura days nor more than one year, or by both such fine and imprisonment, in the discretion of the court, one-half orson or persons giving information which shal lead to conviction.
