SOUTH JETTY NEEDS TO BE EXTENDED AT ONCE

When Capt, Ed Skoggs, of the Roamer was asked if the jetty work had improved the bar, he said. "The work so far has resulted in great benefit to the bar, and making of much better conditions than have existed, but with the north jetty so far out beyond the south jetty it would be very dangerous and almost sure to result in disaster for a tug to attempt to tow over the bar in a wind. The prevailing south west winds will force a tow onto the north jetty. If the south jetty was extended out, or nearly out as far as the north jetty this condition would be remedied and give protection for all shipping and especially tugs with a tow"

Capt. Skoggs has been in command of the Roamer ever since it was placed on Coos Bay-Siuslaw run. He also lived in this vicinity many years and has crossed the Siuslaw bar time after time, and is well acquainted with its conditions now and for years past. This statement made by him indicates that immediate action is needed
