Action which makes life as a whole, more fully worth living is, as such, right action; action which diminishes its value, is as such, wrong. The results upon which morality then bases its incentives and restraints are therefore the actual results involved in the very constitution of things, and not consequences artificially imposed by any external power. We reach in this way the ultimate conception of the imminent moral law, and for myself, I see no way either of avoiding the resolution of all other possible criteria of conduct into the criterion thus established, or of getting behind such a standard in search favorites.
