#### The Murder and Robbery of Jews.

On December 5th Bucharest, in Roumania, was the scene of an attack on the Jews, which reminds one of those frequent assaults on the people throughout Christendom during the Middle Ages and in later centuries. At Bucharest it is said eighteen were killed or fatally injured and large numbers were beaten and robbed. Students of the university started the row and the rougher element continued and finished the work of murder and pillage. A hundred of the Jewbaiters were arrested by the police, but most of these even, it is believed, will escape punishment.

Dr. Isaac M. Wise, the learned Jewish rabbi, and editor of the American Israelite, referring to the Bucharest affair, says:
