The Jews date from what they call the creation of the world, which they think, took place somewhere about 3760 before Christ. The Russians think the world was created about 5508 before the time of Christ, and they count from that period. The Hindoos count time from away back, and the Chinese and Japanese reach back in counting years to a far-away period. There have been many changes in calendars as nations have progressed in knowledge. Studies have been made, and much learned from inscriptions on old monuments, obelisks and pyramids, coins and papyri wrapped around Egyptian mummies.
