We need the schools of our land freed from religion and politics, and we need a uniform system throughout the United States; but our immediate needs in the state of Oregon, is an educational test for county superintendents; good school books furnished by the state free; or at a minimum price, instead of books filled with religious nonsense, made to sell, and by a company at exorbitant prices; a course of study for the common schools; a provison for County Institute s which will relieve the poorly-paid country teachers from paying for poorly-conducted harrangues of politicians; more difference in the grading, and the number of branches necessary in order to secure the higher grades of county certificates and the repeal of the absurd law which compels a teacher to secure a higher grade of certificate or stop teaching, thus throwing out experienced teachers, putting the schools continually in the hands of amateurs and placing a premium on cramming for examinations instead of ability to teach.
