tion from the field of fact, and forced religion to become more consistent and generous. He imparted a stimulation to Freethought that the world had never before known. This impetus resulted in so liberalizing the great monthly magazines and periodicals of the country, that now they are practically either unorthodox or infidel. It created a demand for a knowledge of science, and for the free investigations of nature all along the lines of advanced thought.

He planted in the hearts of millions of people a feeling of kindness and gentleness they never knew before. He was eloquent, but he did not use his eloquence to talk people out of their sober and natural opinions. He did not use rhetoric to flatter and deceive, but as a science to persuade people. He did not direct his eloquence above the heads of his hearers, but pointed his arguments low, for the surer chance of hitting their heads as well as their hearts.

Great he was as an orator, but he far excelled in speech. He spoke words richer than the richest music—words which were a delight when they fell from his lips, and which linger still, in softened speech, in the ears of all who heard them, and which will come long after back to their memories, like old time symphonies steal into the heart.

He made the world better. He made waste places beautiful, built happy homes and filled them with love. If he had done nothing else to merit the love and approbation of mankind, he should be everlastingly revered as the man who did most to free the brains of the human race from the cruel dogmas of the Christian hell.

Every unprejudiced person feels that a great man has fallen; and many that America has lost her greatest and grandest citizen. The news of his sudden death was like the sound of the fall of a mighty oak in the deep stillness of the woods.

In the constellations of the world's great men, where each doth shine and hold his place in the fiery galleries of the dome-bespangled sky, there's none in all that meteor train that more resplendent glows than he who proclaimed the "Liberty of Man, Woman and Child."

Side by side with Galileo, Bruno, Servetus, Voltaire, Humboldt, Spinoza, Shelley, Burns, Darwin, Paine, Franklin, Jefferson, Lincoln, and other great liberators of the bodies and brains of men, he will forever shine, a fixed star, in the burning labyrinths of the world of fame.
