> 3. CHRISTIAN: One who is born of STRICTLY ONE PRICE. Christian parents, or in a country known as Christian, or who is a member of some sect which professes the religion of Christ in some form. Unitarians and Universalists are included, although they deny theological dogmas regarded as essential by the evangelical sects. Mormons are excluded, although they believe in the inspiration of the Bible.

4. FREETHINKER: One who rejects the right of the church and the clergy to prescribe his beliefs, and maintains his individual right to think for himself in matters of religion.


