### WHAT THE OCA WON'T TELL YOU ABOUT MEASURE 9.

As if discrimination and divisiveness weren't enough, the OCA wants to use our government to promote their own prejudices.

- Every agency at all levels of government would be required to play an active role in meeting the OCA's standard, to spend our tax dollars to teach children that homosexuality is "abnormal, unnatural and perverse."

- Public services, facilities and monies could not be used to "promote, encourage or facilitate homosexuality." The gay community couldn't get police protection or a park permit for their annual march. Even church groups would be banned from receiving public funds for community projects if they made public statements accepting of homosexuality.

But the excitement was contagious. Around me, faces smiling were of every conceivable color and composition. And they were almost all stamped by--dare I say it--hope.

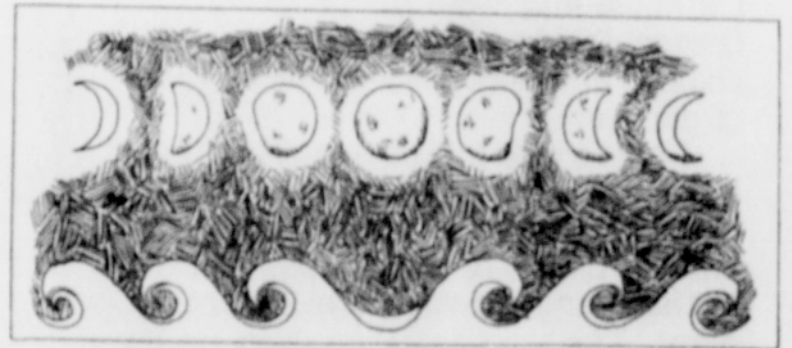
