As if discrimination and divisiveness weren't enough, the OCA wants to use our government to promote their own prejudices.

• Every agency at all levels of government would be required to play an active role in meeting the OCA's standard, to spend our tax dollars to teach children that homosexuality is "abnormal, unnatural and perverse".

• Public services, facilities and monies could not be used to "promote, encourage or facilitate homosexuality."
