Others include spiritual "Mending of the Sacred Hoop," to familiarize the cultural heritages, to teach the practice of potlatch, share skills, arts, news and gossip.

Today, in this paper world of ultra modern technology, very few people know much about the Indian people. They have been stereotyped, as have most other races outside of the white world, when actually Native people are, and have been, before the invasion of Columbus, extremely spiritual. Most native ceremonies, dances and other gatherings are to honor, or make peace with God. Even the Sun Dances are where participants seek sacred power, offer thanks to the Creator, and pray for their family members.

From the desert plateaus of Colorado, from the Badlands of South Dakota, from Long Island shores to Washington's Olympic Peninsula; from these places and beyond, they will come and share their knowledge, their wisdom, and their spirituality. Others will come in search of some, or all of these things. But all will come under the guise of becoming, "one voice, one heart, one mission; and that mission is to strengthen the Indian way of life." It is time to teach a sense of pride to our children, our youth. Pride in one's heritage, pride in being born Indian, and pride in being true to oneself.

Many Elders (Leaders of the people), will express themselves at this gathering. They will admonish us to "find the right direction," or learn the "healing power of the earth, our Mother." While others will share with us messages through their humor, their anger, their prophecies, their silences, and their prevailing concern for future generations.

Perhaps the central message of this "special gathering" is to teach us to explore our heritage, to walk new paths, to seek new experiences, to realize true commitment and vision, and to share the old and the new with all who come.





## RELEASE CLIFFORD DANN

50,000 LETTERS TO CLINTON AND BABBITT CAMPAIGN

**URGENT!!** The Western Shoshone National Council (WSNC) is asking all supporters to help bring a stop to the injustice brought to Clifford Dann by the U.S. government. Please write letters to President Clinton and Bruce Babbitt in support of Clifford during this week. Something simple or detailed like the sample below are encouraged. \* Organize others to do the same. These US leaders must accept responsibility and can no longer ignore the sovereignty of the Western Shoshone Nation. ONCE THESE OFFICIALS RECEIVE 50,000 LETTERS WITHIN THIS PERIOD OF TIME (JULY 26-31), THEY WILL THEN LOOK INTO THIS ISSUE.

May 17, 1993 Western Shoshone elder Clifford Dann was sentenced to 9 months in prison, 2 year probation and a \$5,000 fine in a U.S. courthouse which has no jurisdiction over him. He was charged with obstructing or impeding the duty of an officer.

During the November 1992 Invasion by the U.S. Bureau of Land Management, Clifford tried to block the confiscation of Western Shoshone nationalized livestock by dousing himself with gasoline and threatening to set himself on fire. After being sprayed with fire extinguishers and then beaten with batons, he was arrested and convicted following his trial March 2-3 1993, for assault of a federal officer. Although innocent, Clifford refused to participate in the trial, stating that to do so would acknowledge the claim of U.S. jurisdiction and deny the sovereignty of the Western Shoshone Nation.

### SAMPLE LETTER

Dear \_\_\_\_\_  
I am writing to you on behalf of Clifford Dann, a Western Shoshone elder who has been wrongly imprisoned by the U.S. Court system, a system whose jurisdiction he is not under or acknowledge to. For nearly 10 years now, Clifford has struggled to defend the sovereignty of the Western Shoshone Nation, a nation that was recognized by the U.S. government in the 1863 Treaty of Ruby Valley. "Treaty of peace and friendship" has never been abrogated.

On November 1992 the situation climaxed when the U.S. Bureau of Land Management (BLM) invaded the Western Shoshone Nation and confiscated the horses and livestock of the nation.

On the first day of the invasion Clifford tried to block the confiscation of the horses. In desperation he doused himself with gasoline and threatened to set himself on fire, "By taking away my last livelihood and our lands, you are taking away our lives". He was subsequently beaten with batons, doused with water and knocked to the ground, then arrested and thrown into jail without a trial or attorney.

During his trial March 2-3, Clifford, regardless of his innocence, refused to give in and participate in the trial. He felt that to do so would acknowledge the claim of U.S. jurisdiction and deny the sovereignty of the Western Shoshone Nation.

On May 17, 1993 Clifford was sentenced to 9 months in prison, a year probation and a \$5,000 fine. A harsh and unfair sentence for a case with insufficient evidence, once again it is an example of the U.S. government defending themselves against the injustices of the U.S. government.

As a U.S. leader who has already promised to work with the indigenous people, you must take responsibility for the person who has been so wrongly imprisoned. Please do not continue the genocide of your people. Please respond to these three requests:

1. Release Clifford Dann, not as a person, for no crime was committed by him part, but in realization that he was imprisoned by a court without jurisdiction.
