CLEAN WATER PROBLEMS

Only twenty years after passage of the federal Clean Water Act, many of our nation's lakes, streams and rivers remain polluted with a toxic soup of chemicals and untreated sewage. The nation is far from meeting the goal set by the Act in 1972 to eliminate the discharge of pollutants into our waterways and to make our waters "fishable and swimmable" again.

Even though public support for clean water remains overwhelming, polluting industries and sewage plants continue to evade their discharge permits.

- 87% of the nation's largest dischargers had permit violations, according to a 1990 study of sample permit records.
- 50% of our rivers and more than 50% of our lakes do not even meet minimum water quality standards, according to the U.S. EPA.
- 50% of states have issued health advisories warning only limited consumption of fish from their waters due to mercury contamination.
- U.S. industries send an estimated 448 million pounds of toxic chemicals from incineration and owners each year, virtually all of these toxics are unregulated.
- We continue to lose an average of 290,000 acres of wetlands each year.



Why do we face this continuing crisis?

Our system permits large polluters to evade the law without penalty. Regulators fail to prevent toxic pollution and allow many toxic and carcinogenic pollutants, far in excess of what the law allows, to go unregulated.

We must recommit the nation to the goals of the Clean Water Act, strengthen enforcement, prevent toxic pollution and save our wetlands.

THE POLLUTION LOBBY

Toxic-producing industries and their trade associations, the "Pollution Lobby," are already striving to delay efforts to strengthen the Clean Water Act. Between 1987 and 1991 over 130 chemical industry PACs contributed more than \$13 million to political candidates and lobby agents strengthening legislation designed to prevent toxic pollution and stop toxic discharges.

Many of these companies are among the top dischargers of toxic chemicals to our waterways, including Pine, Occidental Petroleum, Eastman-Kodak, Monsanto, Allied Signal and DuPont.

THE CLEAN WATER CAMPAIGN

Placed against their powerful political lobby is one of the largest environmental coalitions in U.S. history. The Clean Water Network has over 400 groups across the country. The large PRBC national lobbying effort, U.S. PRBC, joins National Audubon Society, Sierra Club, Friends of the Earth, National Resources Defense Council, Trout Unlimited and United Watershed of America.



OSPIRG is collecting petition signatures to Attorney General Reno urging her to use her position as the nation's top law enforcement official to support strengthened Clean Water Act enforcement. OSPIRG is also urging Oregon's Congressional delegation to support the Clean Water Enforcement Act (H.R. 2727), introduced by Rep. Frank Pallone of New Jersey. This legislation would establish mandatory minimum fines for

violators, limit toxic discharges, increase reporting and inspections, and increase citizen rights and participation.

CANNON BEACH SHUTTLE IS USER FRIENDLY

The Cannon Beach Public Shuttle service, which operates on natural gas, began in 1990 in recognition of the need to save energy, help lower pollution, reduce pressure on limited parking facilities in our area and lower traffic congestion. The 1991 twelve-passenger van operates five days a week, 10 a.m. to 1 p.m. and 2-6 p.m. Friday through Tuesday. It has been equipped to meet the specifications of the Americans with Disabilities Act. The Shuttle runs the entire length of the City, north to south and back. During the periods that the Shuttle is not committed to its schedule of routine runs, it is available for community uses if groups provide a qualified driver. The charge is on a mileage use basis. Arrangements can be made through the City Manager's office.
