\*3 YES It is a housekeeping measure that changes deadlines for filling vacancies at General Election, bipartisan support, No Cost. • 4 YES Creates a vacancy if a State Legislator is convicted of a Felony. (Duh!) No Cost "3 NO Bars New or Increased Taxes without Voter approval. Cost: \$1.75 million per year. Sounds good, we get to vote on how much we pay, but it is a simplistic solution. We are a representative form of government, we elect guys to do this. We would be taxed by popularity polls. No thanks.

\*6 NO Candidates may use only contributions from district residents. Cost: \$100,000 per year. Again, simplistic solution to a serious problem, PAC's. Try again

\*7 NO Amends Constitution: Guarantees Equal Protection: Lists Prohibited Grounds of Discrimination. No Cost. What? Are we against equal protection? No, we are against incomplete lists. Oregon has the strongest protection in the country against discrimination. This amendment weakens, not strenthens the Constitution of

\*8 NO Public Employees pay part of salary for pension. Cost Reduction of \$232 million per year. This is a Constitutional Amendment dealing with employee pensions. What's next -- a description of janitors' duties? This is a collective bargaining problem best left to the Unions and the Employers; our representatives. We pay people to do this and if we don't like how they do the job, we vote them out, we don't take on the job ourselves. This is a bad example of Legislation by Initiative which is causing us to vote on so many questions.

\*9 YES Adopts contribution and spending limits, other finance law changes. Cost, one time expense for changes, \$113,000; revenue increase \$2.1 million per year. This is a long legal document that is a good example of the use of the Initiative process used to restrain our politicians. It will allow poor folks to be elected to office! Think of it! Someone representing the majority for a change

• 10 NO Legislature cannot reduce voterapproved sentence without a 2/3 vote. No Cost. Another attempt to do the job that is not being done by the folks we elected. (Think about it.) There is a place to solve that problem on another part of your ballot.

\*11 NO Manditory sentences. Cost: \$461.8 million over five years. Manditory almost anything rubs us the wrong way. The House of Umoja, who knows more about crime prevention that any Judge, Police Officer, Probation Officer, or anyone else you can name is against it and so

are we. \*12 NO Repeals prevailing wage rate requirement for workers on public works. Cost, savings of \$92,000 annually. Again Micro-management by the voters.

\*13 NO Amends Constitution: Government cannot approve, create classifications based on Homosexuality. No Cost. Bastard "son of 9" from the Oh, Christ, Again, folks. We don't care if you worship false gods, don't pay property taxes, and refuse to work on Sunday. You have your "God" on our money and in the pledge of allegiance to our flag, but now you want to come in the bedroom. It is to laugh. 


