When you travel east of the Mississippi, you quickly realize that answering "Washington" confuses things, and maybe even raises a barrier, when you're asked "Where you from?"


"That near Seattle?"

Then, "Oh, that must be up by Hood River?" (This happens even in the Pacific Northwest--people can't keep their headwaters and river mouths straight.)

Then the minor geography lesson:
"The headwaters of the Columbia are in Canada.
The Columbia system drains an area the size of
France. The river is about four miles across at the
mouth. Ilwaco is the last fishing port before the river
dumps into the ocean."

After a while, we just said, "We live in Ilwaco, Washington, the lower left corner of the state. Our house is two blocks from the Columbia River and about half a mile from the Pacific as the crow flies."


