It is the time of year in which we think of gardening, playing softball, surfing, vacationing and a myriad of other outdoor activities. It is also the time of year that sees a dramatic increase in visitors to our area. So for all of us that will occasionally need a respite from the waves of people downtown, here are a few earth friendly adventures available.

Get your old bike out, oil it up and start riding it to town. You will probably arrive at your destination faster, avoid the search for parking at the post office and in general avoid adding to the increased stress on the environment and yourself. If you don't have a bike, riding the shuttle is another easy way to do your business in town. The new shuttle is larger, has seat belts, a bike rack and is handicapped accessible. It is free and operates every day between 10 AM and 6 PM.

The Summer Park Program is for children of residents or parents who work in Cannon Beach. This program is open for kids ages 6 to 12 and operates at City Park Mon. - Fri. 10AM to 4PM. The staff plan a range of activities that include outdoor games, crafts, trips and projects. My favorite is the slip and slide.

The Haystack Rock Awareness Program operates from March to October. This program is not only interesting to go to but also to volunteer for. It is housed at Haystack Rock during low tides.
