AUSTIN, TX

In 2013, voters approved **\$65 million** in General Obligation Bonds to fund housing for the next 5 years.

The result: Over **2,500** apartments and homes built and preserved for families with low incomes since 2006.

Why Not PDX?

BOSTON, MA

\$18 million generated annually for the Neighborhood Housing Trust Fund through developer impact fees on commercial and residential development.

The result: Over **10K** affordable housing units have been preserved and built for Bostonians in the past 25 years.

Why Not PDX?

MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FL

\$20 million raised each year for the Miami-Dade County Homeless Trust through a dining tax.

The result: Miami has successfully reduced street homelessness from **8,000** to **800** people.

Why Not PDX?

SEATTLE, WA

Seattle voters have been supporting affordable housing since 1981. 65% of voters approved the 4th levy for housing generating **\$20 million** annually for the Low Income Housing Fund, at an average cost to homeowners of \$65 per year.

The result: The Low Income Housing fund has helped generate more than **3000** jobs and **\$189 million** in construction and other economic activity.
