Check it out...

AUSTIN, TX

In 2013, voters approved another **\$65 million** in General Obligation Bonds to fund housing for the next 5 years.

The result: Over **2,500** apartments and homes built and preserved for families with low incomes since 2006.

Why Not PDX?

BOSTON, MA

Developer impact fees for commercial and residential development

produce **\$18 million** every year for the Neighborhood Housing Trust Fund.

The result: Over **10K** affordable housing units have been preserved and built for Bostonians in the past 25 years.

Why Not PDX?

MIAMI, FL

A dining-out tax raises **\$20 million** each year for the Miami-Dade County Homeless Trust Fund.

The result: Miami has successfully reduced street homelessness from **8,000** to **800** people.

Why Not PDX?

SEATTLE, WA

Seattle voters have been supporting affordable housing since 1981. Their property tax levy generates **\$20 million** annually, at an average cost to homeowners of **\$65** per year.

The result: Seattle's Low Income Housing fund will create more than **3000** jobs, **\$189 million** in economic activity, and help more than **5,000** low income families.
