

The legislature of Colorado at its last session, adopted strong resolutions testifying to the good results of political equality for men and women. The vote was very nearly unanimous in both senate and assembly. The resolutions provide that a resolution from the governor and the legislature be sent to other states recommending the enfranchisement of women. This was after practical trial of five years, and means a great deal.

Dunaway; lecture, 'Chalk Talk,' Frank Beard, Boston; orchestral concert, chorus. There are many other good things in the program.

### The Grand Old Fourth Celebrated in Dayton.

July 4th, 1890 has come and gone. This was the last 4th of July that will be celebrated in the 1890's—the next celebration will be in 1900, which will soon be inscribed on all documents and records. The 4th of July, the United States of America holiday, or Christmas as it has been termed—it being the anniversary of the birth of a great and mighty nation whose territory has spread throughout the earth, and her rule acknowledged by millions of her people in all parts of both the old and new world.

As customary the day was ushered in by the firing of guns and crackers. The day proved to be a perfect one for enjoyment—just cool enough to be pleasant, and everybody celebrated. It is estimated that over 3000 people celebrated the glorious Fourth in Dayton. We are informed that many more would have been here to take part in the celebration, but failed to do so on account of the rumor, which had no foundation whatever, that smallpox was here.

The business men of the town did what they could for the entertainment of their guests. The streets were well sprinkled which made them free of dust, and the park was well seated. All business firms had the front of their business houses neatly and tastefully decorated.

The published program was carried out in order. It was formed at 10 a. m. and followed the line of march to the park. The parade was made up of bicyclists, G. A. R. veterans, liberty car, presidents of the U. S. fraternal orders, visiting Woodmen, Prosperity Circle Women of Woodcraft, Old Hickory camp No. 200, president and orator of the day, Hon. T. P. Caughlin grand marshal of the day.

The morning exercises at the park were: Music, remarks by S. W. Sigler, who acted as president by request of Mayor Harris; prayer by Rev. J. Bowerox, chaplain; reading of declaration of Independence by Prof. S. S. Duncan; graphophone selections by A. H. Robinson, oration by Rev. C. E. Crandall, basket dinner.

The afternoon exercises were: music, recitation by Abbie Nichols, drill, duet by Inez and Henry Hewitt, recitation Ona Bradley, oration by Hon. T. P. Caughlin. In the chopping contest Nosh Robinson and John Hash contestants, Robinson was the winner by one stroke. Hash's ax glanced, prize an ax. In the sawing contest Barks and Creon were ahead; time 47 seconds in sawing through a log 22 inches in diameter—prize, two felt hats. Nail driving contest by ladies, Mrs. B. Gabriel won the prize—a fine parasol. Best decorated bicycle—gent's, Louis Clark, prize, sweater. Ladies best decorated bicycle, Miss L. Courtney—ladies shirt waist. 50 yard foot race for girls of 15. Miss Effie Gabriel—silk sash.

Everybody appeared to enjoy themselves, and everything passed off pleasantly with nothing to mar the enjoyment of those in attendance. But late in the evening a man named Noble, from Chehalis, on his way home, when passing Wm. Abbill's home near big bridge, made some vulgar remarks in the presence of Mrs. Abbill. Her husband resented the remarks by throwing a hammer at Noble, which
