In Illinois, which is generally regarded as a well settled agricultural state, there are 4,000,000 acres of swamp land, in Michigan there are nearly 6,000,000. Fertile Iowa 2,000,000. Minnesota almost 5,000,000 acres of rich surveyed swamp lands, and huge swamp areas not yet surveyed. Arkansas has large swamp areas. There is swamp area in eastern half of the United States which is equal in extent to the great agricultural states of Indiana, Illinois and Iowa, with three or four smaller eastern states thrown in.
