Odd Ceremony.
Two days annually are observed in illuminating the graves of the Central cemetery in Vienna. This burying place, while comparatively modern, is regarded as one of the two most beautiful in the world. The illuminating ceremony occurs on Ascension day and on the anniversary of the burning of the Ring theater in 1881, when many fell victims to the flames. When stationary lamp posts of midget size are at the sides of a plot, these are lighted, but those not equipped depend upon the bereaved loved ones who still remain to mourn them to carry lighted candles and torches as a means of illumination.

BRITAIN AFTER WORLD'S OIL

President Tells Senate John Bull Would Exclude Aliens.

Washington.—Great Britain's policy with reference to world petroleum supplies is reported to be to exclude aliens from the control of petroleum supplies within the empire, and to endeavor to obtain some measure of control over oil properties in foreign countries, the senate was informed in a state department report transmitted by President Wilson.

The report, signed by Under Secretary Frank L. Park, was furnished in response to a resolution by Senator Gore, democrat, Oklahoma, asking what disabilities were being imposed upon American exploitation of world oil resources by other countries.

Railroad Wage Delay is Dangerous.

Chicago.—The heads of the 17 railroad brotherhoods issued a statement here expressing apprehension as to the effect of further delay in meeting the workers' request for increased wages. The brotherhood officers arrived in Chicago for the resumption of wage hearings before the railway labor board.

House Bill Aimed at Sugar Dealers.

Washington.—Sugar dealers would be required to sell their holdings, according to uniform prices filed with the Federal Trade commission or pay a tax of two cents a pound on all sugar sold, under a bill introduced in the house by Representative Steenerson, Minnesota.

British Soldiers Rushed to Ireland.

Cork.—Two thousand troops from England were landed at Bantry Saturday and immediately distributed throughout West Cork. Troops to the number of 150 also arrived at Skibberdeen. They commanded several buildings there.

HOUSE SUSTAINS PRESIDENT'S VETO

Washington.—President Wilson's veto of the legislative appropriation bill, as containing an infringement on executive authority, was sustained in the house against the effort of the republican majority to override it.

Though aided by a handful of democrats, the republicans failed by 28 votes to obtain the necessary two-thirds majority to repass the bill over the president's disapproval. The measure then went back to the appropriation committee for elimination of the sections objected to and will be returned to the house for passage in its modified form.

The republicans rolled up 170 votes to overcome the veto, but the democrats cast 127 votes to sustain the president. The vote carries with it a denial of opportunity for the senate to attempt offsetting the veto, for the redrafted measure will leave the house without the provision relating to powers of the joint committee on printing, at which the veto was aimed.

HAROLD HOWELL ACQUITTED

Prisoner in Jail for Eight Months on Charge of Killing Girl.

Marshfield, Or.—Harold Howell, aged 16, has his freedom after eight months in the county jail and three times facing trial in the circuit court on the charge of murdering Lillian Leuthold at Bandon on July 27. The jury in the third trial returned a verdict of not guilty in the circuit court at Coquille. The jurors were out 17 hours.
