W. J. and Maurice Robertson, made a business trip to Portland Monday.

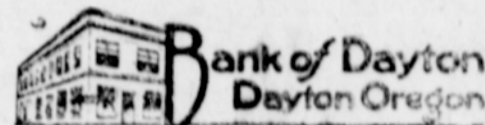
