Carl Reister attended a Sunday evening meeting at Unionvale.

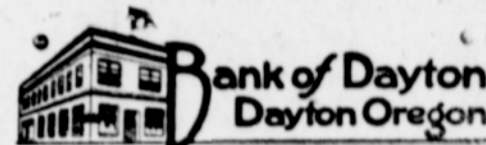
Mrs. Harvey Ross and Miss Zelma Biddle attended the latter sessions of the Evangelical Camp meeting at Jennings Lodge.
