Farm Reminders
(From O. A. C. Experiment Station)

If properly mixed, homemade bordeaux spray is superior to the commercially prepared product, says H. P. Bares, plant pathologist at the Oregon experiment station. The ready mixed material is inferior for a winter spray especially as it does not adhere so readily as that prepared on the farm. Where the constituents are sold in separate packages by commercial concerns a good product may be prepared conveniently from them. Full directions for mixing bordeaux may be obtained free by writing to the experiment station at Corvallis.

It is unnecessary to use more than two ounces of copper carbonate to the bushel in treating wheat for smut by the dust method, if it is good material rightly applied. Experiments just completed by the experiment station prove that the use of larger amounts is not only a waste but an inconvenience to the user.

Protection against winter infection of Oregon loganberry canes with leaf anthracnose, bud blight, and cane die back may be afforded to a considerable extent by spraying the canes at this time of year with bordeaux mixture, says the experiment station. The canes should be covered from base to tip.

Oregon wheat growers are advised by the experiment station to use the standard copper carbonate for wheat smut rather than the various mercury dust compounds being put on the market by commercial concerns. Careful experiments just completed at the station indicate that the latter are far more expensive to use and only partially effective in smut control. High test copper carbonate should always be used.

A permanent wound dressing for fruit trees may be made by mixing dry bordeaux mixture with raw linseed oil. It is harmless and effective, says O A C specialists.

MILK

Milk may carry disease germs and in this way infect persons using milk. To prevent this, milk is often pasteurized. In preventing the transmission of disease germs, greater emphasis should be placed on the methods of obtaining the milk. The dairyman should have clean pails and clean hands and the udder of the cow should be cleaned before milking. The farmer who takes the milk pail from the fence, and, without washing his hands, milks the cow which has been standing in a dirty stable is not getting clean milk. Furthermore, he is neglecting a duty and responsibility he owes his family and his neighbors. The poisons and dirt in milk are real sources of danger to the body, but they can be eliminated by the careful collection and distribution of the milk supply. The cows should be cared for in a sanitary stable and every means used to keep them clean and healthy. Cows should be cleaned preparatory to milking. Covered pails should be used to keep the milk free from dirt.

It is very important to keep the milk clean after it is collected. All bottles should be sterilized and the hands should not be allowed to come in contact with the milk or inside of the bottles. Flies and dirt should not gain access to the milk at any time.

In spite of the care exercised in many places in collecting milk, a certain amount of infectious material gains entrance to milk after it is collected. To prevent these organisms getting into the body and so causing diseases, pasteurization is widely practiced. Cities after pasteurizing milk have noticed a drop in the amount of sickness and in the number of deaths.

The history of city and state health departments is full of epidemics of typhoid fever, scarlet fever, diphtheria and septic sore throat, caused by milk infected by a sick person or by a carrier on a dairy farm.

In order that uncooked milk shall be safe it must come from cows who are free from tuberculosis or other diseases; the barn and dairy building must be scrupulously clean, people who have sore throats or any other signs of disease must not milk the cows or handle the milk in any way, and the milk must be cooled at once and kept cool.

High standards increase the respect of the milk industry for milk sanitation. High standards increase the confidence of the consumer and consequently increase milk consumption.

Examination for Forest Ranger

An examination for forest ranger will be held on October 27, in twenty-six different states, according to word just received by district forester C. M. Granger, at Portland. Important changes are that receipt of applications will close on October 17, 1925. No applicant will be allowed to try the examination unless he has received an admission card in advance from the U. S. civil service commission, Washington, D. C.; hence, forest officers urge all prospective applicants to secure at once form 2415, either from the commission at Washington or from any forest supervisor.

Entrance salary for forest ranger in the U. S. forest service is \$1500 in the United States, and \$1900 in Alaska. Outside of the salary, the government allows a mileage on privately-owned automobiles when used in official business, and actual expenses when absent on official duty from official headquarters. Houses or ranger stations are furnished rangers or an allowance made in their salaries in lieu of quarters. In addition to the above, forest officers are protected by the federal compensation act, which covers accidental injuries and monthly payments to dependents in case of death. The age limits for the examination are 21 to 35 inclusive.

Forest rangers with experience and proven ability are eligible to a maximum salary of \$2400 per annum. Many of the higher positions in the forest service are now filled by men who started in as forest rangers.

The examination consists of three parts, educational and mental test, practical questions relative to the duties of the position, and experience. A medical certificate is required but no photograph. Applicants with military or naval records must attach to their applications original, photostat or certified copies of their original discharge.

Forest officers state that there are openings for good, live men with practical experience in the woods, and forest school graduates with practical experience.

In Oregon the examination will be held at the 13 headquarters towns of forest supervisors and at the eight in Washington.
