NEW CLERKS' AND SHERIFFS' LAW.

S. B. No. 12

An act to provide the compensation of the Sheriffs and Clerks of the counties of Linn, Lane, Jackson, Benton, Yamhill, Marion, Douglas, Coos, Curry, Clackamas, Union, Umatilla, Washington and Polk, in this State, and to prescribe the manner in which such compensation shall be paid, and also to provide for the payment to said counties fixed sums of money for the performance of certain services by the Sheriffs and Clerks of said counties.

Be it enacted by Legislative Assembly of the State of Oregon:

SECTION 1. The Sheriffs of the counties of Linn, Lane, Jackson, Benton, Yamhill, Marion, Douglas, Coos, Curry, Clackamas, Union, Umatilla, Washington and Polk, in this State, shall each receive as compensation for their services the following annual salaries: 1st, The Sheriff of Linn county, the sum of twenty hundred dollars; 2d, The Sheriff of Lane county, the sum of fifteen hundred dollars; 3d, The Sheriff of Benton county, eighteen hundred dollars; 4th, The Sheriff of Jackson county, twelve hundred dollars; 5th, The Sheriff of Yamhill county, fifteen hundred dollars; 6th, The Sheriff of Marion county, twenty-five hundred dollars; 7th, The Sheriff of Douglas county, fifteen hundred dollars; 8th, The Sheriff of Coos county, twelve hundred dollars; 9th, The Sheriff of Curry county, eight hundred dollars; 10th, The Sheriff of Clackamas county, twenty hundred dollars; 11th, The Sheriff of Union county, twelve hundred dollars; 12th, The Sheriff of Umatilla county, twelve hundred dollars; 13th, The Sheriff of Washington county, fifteen hundred dollars; 14th, The Sheriff of Polk county, eighteen hundred dollars.

Sec. 2. In addition to the salaries provided in Section 1 of this Act for the Sheriffs therein named, they shall each receive the mileage now allowed Sheriffs by law, and such mileage shall be paid in the same manner as before the passage of this Act. In addition to the salaries and mileage provided by this Act for Sheriffs, they shall each be allowed the sum of four dollars per week for the board and keeping of any person confined as prisoner, or otherwise, in the county jail.

Sec. 3. No mileage shall be allowed any Sheriff of any county mentioned in this Act, for the performance of any service for the State, or any county therein, unless such Sheriff shall first file with the Clerk of the proper county a statement under oath of the number of miles actually traveled by him or his deputy in the performance of his duty in the premises, and no constructive mileage shall in any case be allowed.

Sec. 4. The Clerks of the counties heretofore mentioned in this Act shall each receive as compensation for their services the following annual salaries, and no fees or perquisites shall be allowed any of them: 1st, The Clerk of Linn county, eighteen hundred dollars; 2d, The Clerk of Lane county, fifteen hundred dollars; 3d, The Clerk of Benton county, fifteen hundred dollars; 4th, The Clerk of Jackson county, twelve hundred dollars; 5th, The Clerk of Yamhill county, fourteen hundred dollars; 6th, The Clerk of Marion county, twenty-five hundred dollars; 7th, The Clerk of Douglas county, fifteen hundred dollars; 8th, The Clerk of Coos county, twelve hundred dollars; 9th, The Clerk of Curry county, eight hundred dollars; 10th, The Clerk of Clackamas county, twenty hundred dollars; 11th, The Clerk of Union county, fifteen hundred dollars; 12th, The Clerk

of Umatilla county, twelve hundred dollars; 13th, The Clerk of Washington county, fifteen hundred dollars; 14th, The Clerk of Polk county, fifteen hundred dollars.

Sec. 5. The Sheriff and Clerk of the counties mentioned in this Act shall each receive out of the treasury of their county, at the end of each month, one-twelfth of their annual salary, upon presenting a warrant therefor, signed by the County Judge of the county.

Sec. 6. In case it shall at any time become necessary for the Clerk or Sheriff of any county mentioned in this Act to employ a deputy to assist in the performances of any of the duties pertaining to his office, such deputy shall be allowed as compensation for his services such sum as the County Judge and County Commissioners of such county deem just, and he shall receive the same out of the county treasury in the same manner that the Clerk receives his salary.

Sec. 7. No money shall be ordered paid out of the treasury of any county in the State for the services of any deputy Sheriff or deputy Clerk unless it shall be made to appear to the satisfaction of the County Judge and County Commissioners of the county, by the showing of the Sheriff or Clerk, as the case may be, that the services performed by such deputy were indispensably necessary.

Sec. 8. The following fees shall be paid to the several counties mentioned in this Act for the following services performed by the Clerks thereof: For issuing any writ, order or process, except a subpoena forty cents; for issuing a subpoena for one person, twenty cents, and two cents for each additional person named therein; for filing each paper or pleading, except in case of claims filed in the County Court against a county, five cents; for filing claims against a county, three cents; for entering any judgment, order or decree of any court, twenty cents; for each folio after the first in any judgment, order or decree, ten cents; for each folio of any journal entry, other than a judgment, order or decree, ten cents; for taking an affidavit, including the administration of the oath, ten cents; for swearing a witness, five cents; for taking and approving an undertaking or bond in any case, twenty-five cents; for making and filing judgment roll, twenty cents; for making copy of journal entries for judgment roll, two cents for each folio; for docketing judgment or decree in judgment docket, twenty-five cents; for making copies of any record or file, for each folio, ten cents; for official certificate, under seal of any court, twenty-five cents; for official certificate, without seal, twenty-five cents; for issuing commission to take testimony, fifty cents; for taking depositions, for each folio, ten cents; for taking costs and disbursements, ten cents; for docketing cause in any action or proceeding, other than the docketing of a claim against a county, in a County Court, twenty-five cents; for swearing jury on the trial of any action, suit or proceeding, twenty-five cents; for receiving, reading, filing and recording verdict in any suit, action or proceeding, forty cents; for issuing letters testamentary of administration or guardianship, forty cents; for recording any judgment, order, bill or appointment of any executor, administrator or guardian, for each folio, ten cents; for recording the appointment of an administrator of dower, twenty-five cents; for making all indexes in relation to an estate, twenty-five cents; for making and keeping a record of accounting and distribution in relation to any estate, one dollar; for filing and making a certified copy of a declaration to become a citizen of the United

States, fifty cents; for entering judgment of admission of any alien to citizenship, and making a certified copy thereof, one dollar; for making out an appointment in pursuance of any order of the County Court, twenty cents; for issuing any license required by law, other than a marriage license, fifty cents; for receiving, receipting for, keeping and disbursing money, on the first five hundred dollars, one fourth per centum; on the second five hundred dollars, one-eighth per centum; on all sums over one thousand dollars, one-sixteenth per centum; for taking and certifying an acknowledgment to a deed or other instrument of writing, fifty cents; for recording any deed, declaration, contract or other private writing, required by law to be recorded, for each folio, ten cents; for making and issuing a marriage license, registering the same, filing, recording and indexing marriage certificate, two dollars; for filing and making entry when required by law, of any article of incorporation, bill of sale or chattel mortgage, twenty-five cents; for entering and attesting satisfaction of a mortgage or judgment, ten cents; for each poll book required by law, one dollar; for taking each justification to a bond or undertaking, fifteen cents; for making in the several indexes the entries required of the filing and recording of any instrument, paper or notice, for each entry, five cents; for receiving and filing every mandate from the Supreme Court and accompanying papers, ten cents; for entering issuance of attachment in register, fifteen cents; for furnishing fee bill to any person, twenty-five cents; for entering issuance of execution in execution docket, fifteen cents; for issuing returns of execution and how disposed of in execution docket, for each folio, ten cents; for recording any private writing, less than one folio, twenty cents.

Sec. 9. The following fees shall be paid to the counties mentioned in Section 1 of this Act for the following services performed by the Sheriffs thereof: For serving any writ for the enforcement of a judgment or decree, fifty cents; for serving any summons, subpoena, notice or order, on each person served, fifteen cents; for executing any provisional remedy, thirty-five cents; for serving any bench warrant or warrant of arrest, seventy-five cents; for taking an inquest by a jury for the trial of the right of property, two dollars; for taking and approving an undertaking or bond, twenty-five cents; for making and delivering a copy of any process, order or notice necessary to complete the service thereof, for each folio, ten cents; for making and delivering a copy of any process, order or notice necessary to complete the service thereof, for each folio, ten cents; for all money actually made on any process and returned to the Clerk, one per centum on the first thousand dollars, and one-half per centum on all sums over one thousand dollars; for making a conveyance of real property sold on any process to be paid by the grantee, two dollars; for making a certificate of sale of real property, twenty-five cents; for making a certificate of sale of personal property, when required or demanded, to be paid by the purchaser, twenty-five cents.

Sec. 10. The fees provided for by this Act shall be paid to the Sheriff or Clerk as the case may be, at the time the services are performed, and they shall each keep an itemized account of all the moneys paid them, and furnish a copy of the same to the County Court, under oath that the same is correct and true, at the end of every month, at which time they shall each pay over to the Treasurer of the county all moneys received by them respectively during the

month last preceding, taking his receipt therefor.

Sec. 11. The County Court of either of the counties mentioned in this Act may at any time summon the Clerk or Sheriff of the county to appear before it and render an accounting in regard to all moneys received by either in pursuance of this Act, and if it shall be found that the Sheriff or Clerk has failed to observe the provisions of this Act, or is in default in any manner in reference to paying over any money to the Treasurer of the county as herein provided, the Court shall certify its findings in the matter to the Prosecuting Attorney for the county and it shall be his duty to at once commence an action in the name of the county against the sureties or or bondsmen of such Clerk or Sheriff as the case may be.

Sec. 12. All Acts and parts of Acts regulating the fees of Clerks and Sheriffs of any county in this State not mentioned in this Act are hereby continued in force in such county and all Acts and parts of Acts regulating the fees of Sheriffs and Clerks of the counties mentioned in this Act are hereby repealed so far as the counties herein mentioned are concerned. Approved by the Governor on the 25th of October, 1880.
