**ORDINANCE NO. 126**

**AN ORDINANCE TO COMPEL OWNERS OF PROPERTY IN PORT ORFORD TO KEEP DOWN THE GROWTH OF GORSE THEREON; FIXING A PENALTY FOR VIOLATIONS AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY**

WHEREAS, if gorse were allowed to get started on the City of Port Orford it could become a great fire hazard and might result in the destruction of our city.

NOW, THEREFORE, it is the opinion of the Common Council of the City of Port Orford that this pest could be kept down if the property owners would cooperate with the city in preventing it from getting started on their properties.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Common Council of the City of Port Orford that every means be employed to keep down gorse and not allowing it to get started in the City of Port Orford and to this end the support of every property owner is hereby solicited.

An emergency is hereby declared to exist and this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after the date of its passage and approval by the Mayor. Within 30 days after written notice that any gorse exists on their property they shall remove the same.

Any violations of this requirement upon the part of the property owner or owners shall be deemed a misdemeanor and upon conviction in the recorder's court a fine of not less than \$10.00 nor more than \$50.00, in addition to the cost of removing such gorse shall be imposed, and the same shall be collected by levy upon the property on which the gorse has been removed, if not otherwise paid.

Passed by the Common Council this 10th day of July, 1945.
