

Bacon Combines For Imaginative Casserole Dish

In food preparation, it's the combination that counts. For example, cured pork products are tasty when served alone, but they can really dress up a meal when combined with other foods in an imaginative manner.

Let's look at Canadian-style bacon for a moment. This cured meat needn't be relegated to the breakfast table only. Bake it in a casserole with colorful and seasonal foods, and you'll have a delicious supper treat.

The bacon slices are placed atop a mixture of squash, cranberries, pecans, brown and white sugars and cinnamon. The flavor and texture are something special. And very little preparation time is involved. . . . Just chopping the pecans, halving cranberries and blending the ingredients.

Canadian-style bacon is the cured and smoked boneless loin of pork. It can be baked in a whole piece, or sliced for broiling, panbroiling or including in

casseroles, states meat expert Reba Staggs.

- Canadian-Style Bacon — Squash Casserole**
- 6 slices Canadian-style bacon, cut 1/4 inch thick
 - 2 packages (12 ounces each) frozen cooked squash, defrosted
 - 1/2 cup brown sugar
 - 1/4 cup granulated sugar
 - 1/2 teaspoon cinnamon
 - 1/2 cup fresh cranberries, cut in halves
 - 1/2 cup coarsely chopped pecans
- Grease a 1 1/2-quart casserole. Combine squash, sugars, cinnamon, cranberries and pecans. Pour mixture into casserole. Top with Canadian-style bacon slices. Bake in a moderate oven (350° F.) 45 minutes. 6 servings.

Men, if you believe marriage is a share-alike partnership, then let your wife try out those power tools she's been using for Father's Day or your birthday.

We're not suggesting that you turn your workshop into a social gathering spot, but you can ease your mate's burden by showing her how to speed up several time and energy consuming chores.



The ordinary electric drill, for example, can be fitted with a wire brush. With it, your wife can quickly clean up a charcoal blackened barbecue grill, normally a tedious arm-wearing job. It's best to mount the grill horizontally, so she can manipulate the drill with two free hands. Don't use the electric tool near water, naturally, or with wet hands.

Put a wool bonnet or cover on your drill or sander and your spouse will actually enjoy polishing furniture. She'll discover that there's little comparison between the mirror-smooth finish provided by power polishing and hand-rubbed surfaces. And she'll find it easier to keep highly polished surfaces clean.

She may be so pleased you can persuade her to shine up the car, too. Just make sure she always uses a wax made for use with electric tools.
