## Pirates Squelch Bandon In Surprise Upset, 52-51

The Pacific Pirates handed Bandon's Tigers a shock upset Friday night that was determined only by the final gun that gifted Pacific with a hard-earned 52-51 win.

Pacific's Frank Smith was granted hero's honors when, with only seven seconds on the clock, and a tied up ball game, he walked to the foul line for a one and one and got one. This lone counter was the big one for Pacific when a desperation shot by Doug Giles smacked the basket and bounced off to oblivion, letting the Pirates rack-up their third Sunset conference victory.

Pacific earned the first score, and from there were out in front, or tied, all the way. First period gave them an 18-16 edge, with a halftime margin of 37-26. It was 47-38 for the steamed-up Pirates at the end of the third quarter.

Larry Bowman headed the Pirate scoring with 15 counters, followed by Smith's 14.

The Panthers are idle this Saturday but will be shaping up for their second meeting with the Gold Beach five the following week.

The league consists of teams from Brookings, Gold Beach, Port Orford, Langlois and Ophir.

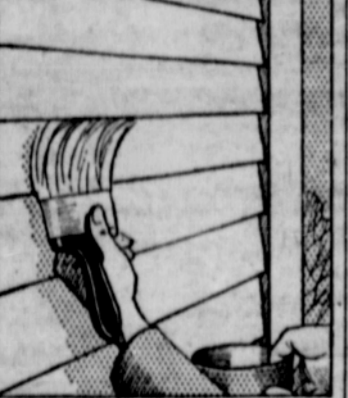
### JUNIOR VARSITY

## Huge Fire Losses Can Be Cut—If

The nation's huge industrial fire losses, estimated to cost about \$200,000,000 yearly, can be cut if management views fire as a menace to production. Management needs training in the consequences of fire just as much as employees do, according to J. R. Bachtler of U.S. Steel Corporation. The attitude of "we've been doing it this way for years and we've never had a fire" must go if crippling fire losses are to be reduced, said Bachtler. He is fire chief of U.S. Steel's Gary (Ind.) Steel Works. Bachtler said that training management to understand the necessity for automatic plant fire protection, as well as for employee training in fire prevention and fire fighting techniques, is the main job of the person in charge of fire protection in any plant. "Unfortunately," Bachtler said, "it often takes a serious fire, or worse yet, several serious fires to put across this message."
